| Edward <u>B.</u> Lowry                | 1988-89 | first to serve as CABA President, VSB President and Chair of the Southern Conference of Bar Presidents, first CABA president to graduate from Woodley Hills (elementary) School and first CABA president to marry and stay married to his grade school sweetheart (also a Woodley Hills graduate); first CABA president to prove his High School classmates wrong by not only graduating from high school, but also college and law school — all without ever being jailed for more than 24 hours; the only CABA president to have taught Fran Lawrence everything he knew about playing football in high school (now the head injuries make sense). |
